
(Kindergarten – Grade 5)

Differentiation Makes the Difference

The NSU University School Lower School provides a strong academic foundation for children while encouraging them to explore their interests and creativity. Our research-based Lower School curriculum enables children to become engaged and effective learners. They learn to think critically, to cooperate, and collaborate with others. Our active classrooms promote a joy of learning and sets the stage for future success in school and well beyond.

Lower School seeks to find the best in all students by providing them with multi-faceted classrooms and an instructional methodology that differs from traditional models. Our faculty approach the learning and teaching process by identifying differences in children and optimizing each student's learning style. Teachers act as facilitators and enable students to be at the center of the decision-making process. Classroom learning extends beyond the walls of the classroom and is rigorous, active, and engaging.

Lower Elementary (Grades K-2)

All Lower School children are engaged in research-based, joyful learning, whether in the classrooms, Innovation spaces, the hallways, or the outdoors. Students in Grades K-2 enjoy a robust program of studies that not only emphasizes strong proficiency in language arts and mathematics but allows students to work with trained specialists in the areas of innovation, world languages (Spanish and French), art, music, and physical education. We consider every subject integral to developing critical, creative and flexible thinking- essential skills for the future- and we guide our students to take risks and stretch themselves in order to meet and surpass high academic standards.

Upper Elementary (Grades 3-5)

Building upon the strong foundation in Grades K-2, students in Grades 3-5 continue to refine and build upon their skills in readiness for Middle School. Beginning in Grade 3, students are placed in homeroom classes based on language arts abilities but are reassessed for math placement so as to be grouped with students who show similar proficiency in the area of math. Students continue to enjoy the opportunity to engage with the special area teachers in the areas of innovation, world languages, art, music, and physical education.

In Grades 4 and 5, students also have the opportunity to choose an elective. This provides choice for the student and allows them to follow a passion they may have, a hallmark of the NSU University School experience. Some examples of potential elective options are robotics/coding, strings (violins), dance, video production, and gardening. Students select an elective option in the Spring prior to the new school year.

BRIDGES

The BRIDGES Program at NSU University School is an innovative, personalized, and technology rich educational experience for students in Grades 2-5 who have mild to moderate learning disabilities and average to gifted intelligence. Unique to this intervention program, students benefit from the academic excellence and social environment of NSU University School, teachers specially trained to teach children with learning differences, and the educational support and services of Nova Southeastern University.



Guidance

Recognizing the key role that social-emotional learning plays in the lives of young children, NSU University School is pleased to provide two full-time Guidance Counselors who interact daily with our children. Our Guidance staff provides specific lessons in the classrooms that focus on the individual growth and development of each child as well as the skills needed to interact well in a community. In addition to classroom instruction, Guidance Counselors also provide opportunities for small groups of students to dialogue together on specific topics and/or provide individual support services for students. In the Upper Elementary grades, students participate in a unique program called THRIVE which focuses on teaching organizational skills, study skills, goal-setting, time management and prioritization, how the brain controls our body, and the exploration of fixed versus a growth mindset.

Opportunities for Involvement

Lower School students have numerous opportunities to participate in a variety of extra-curricular clubs and activities throughout the year. Students may join the Spanish Club or engage in community service projects through K-Kids, join the newspaper staff, or contribute art/photography or edit our Lower School's literary magazine, Treasures and Dreams. Students who enjoy music have the opportunity to

participate in various musical groups or performances. If a student has an interest in engineering, the Robotics Club or Wonder League provides learning opportunities or even the chance to compete with other schools. Fifth grade students take on leadership roles through participation in the morning Safety Patrol, WUTV morning news, and Student Government. There is truly something for everyone!

Before and After Care Program

Early morning supervision, also known as Before Care, is provided daily from 7:45 to 8:05 a.m. at no charge. At 8:05 a.m., students are welcomed into their classrooms in readiness for starting school promptly at 8:15 a.m. After Care, a fee-based program for students who want to play board games, watch movies, participate in outdoor play, work on homework, and/or read a book, is available from 3:15-5:45 p.m. each day.

After-School Activities

The After-School Activities Program provides opportunities for students to pursue interests and talents beyond the regular school day. This fee-based program supplements the daily experiences of NSU University School students by providing specialized instruction in a variety of different areas. There are more than 30 individual class choices available, including dance, sports, crafts, cooking, and academic enrichment. The After-School Activities Program is from 3:30 to 4:30 p.m. After school enrichment is also available through NSU University School's Academy of the Arts.
